

Descendants of John Dorris

Generation No. 1

1. JOHN³ DORRIS (*WILLIAM*², *JOSEF*¹) was born 1752 in Ireland, and died 1830 in Marion Co., Illinois. He married (1) NANCY Abt. 1775 in Hunterdon County, New Jersey. She was born Abt. 1750, and died 1784 in Orange Co., N.C.. He married (2) ANGEL MACE Aft. 1787 in Dorchester, MD, daughter of JOSIAS MACE and ANNA. She was born Aft. 1765 in Dorchester, Maryland, and died 1817 in Smith Co., Tenn.

Page 17 of book My Dorris Family Line

by Burnice Dorris Waggoner reads as follows:

No record of John Dorris's war service has been found, but this should in no way detract from Dr. Dorris's statement that he served in the American Army. The latter term includes both the Continental Line and the militia. His service was probably in the New Jersey Militia. He was married and had several children during the war and the family lived in Hunterdon County, New Jersey. Although he apparently owned no land in New Jersey, his name does appear on the tax list for September, 1779, for Maidenhead Township, Hunterdon County. His name also appears on the tax list for Hopewell Township, Hunterdon County for January 1, 1781. John Dorris apparently supplied wood for Washington's army. The following voucher is on file in the New Jersey State Archives in Trenton:

"Received from John Stockton, Quartermaster at Princeton,
New Jersey, Certificate No. 60, for \$600.00 for wood,
Due February 2, 1780.
(S) John Dorris"

(Please note that it would appear that John Dorris is the Uncle of John not his father)
(believe the father of young John was Isaac)

Another note on Page 24 & 25 of book says:

Young John Dorris son of John Dorris (Hopewell, New Jersey) married Phebe Culbertson January 12, 1795. The marriage bond required at the time might be of interest and is shown below, (copy in book of original script) transcribed from the original script:

"Know all men by these present we John Dorris and John Dorris are here and firmly bound unto his Excellency Richard D. Spaight, Esquire, Governor and his successors in office, in the sum of Five hundred pounds for the payment thereof we bind ourselves and each of heirs, Executors, Administrators, etc., jointly and severally firmly by these present. Sealed with our Seals and dated this 12 January 1795.

"The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bounden John Dorris hath obtained a License to so Commence the rites of Matrimony between him and Phebe Culbertson, now if there shall not hereafter appear any lawful cause to obstruct said marriage, then the above obligation to be void else remain in full force and viretue.

The Culbertsons lived on the south bank of the Haw River within a mile or two of the Dorris Farmsteads. This was a very highly respected family, active in the Revolution , served as a constable and member of the county court.

"We suspect that John Dorris the Elder was born in Ireland before 1750 and that he was Old William's fourth eldest son. John Dorris is the only one of Old William's son for whom we have discovered New Jersey public records from the 18th century. The tax rolls of Maidenhead Township, Hunterdon County,New Jersey in September 1779, and again in Hopewell Township, Hunterdon County in May 178, January 1781 and June 1781 listed a John Dorris. Dirt poor John had only two cows for rateables."

"According to oral tradition , John was one of three sons of William Dorris the Patriarch who fought in the American Revolution. It is likely he served in the New Jersey militia like his brother William who fought in the Hunterdon County, militia Unfortunately, New Jersey Militia records have not survived, and John did not live long enough to apply for a pension. The only evidence we have of John's patriotism was a sale and delivery of wood to the Colonial Army in 1780 in New Jersey."

"John and Angel had arrived in Orange County,North Carolina by 1787 where John appeared in teh Chatham District tax rolls. Like his father and brothers, John became a land owner for the first time. John purchased 204 acres on Quaker Creek from Henry Murray for 100 pounds on February 1,1789.(See Orange County Deeds 4/285)

The deed recorded that the land was on Quaker Creek. Arthur Levine and John Stanford witnessed the transaction. He later purchased an additional 100 acres from his father and mother in 1790 (See Orange County Deeds 4/398)."

"John appeared on the tax rolls of Orange County in 1791 in Orange District listed as John Dorris, son of William, and again in 1792 listed simply as John Dorris. In 1789 he was a juror on the County Court, and in 1790 he witnessed John Murray's sale of 200 acres to his brother Robert. In May 1794 , John Dorris and his wife Angel and her brother Ezekial Mace granted powers of attorney to Edmund Brannock and "our uncle" Alexander Robb for the sale of two tracts of land, Buttons Intent and Grand Riding, property of Angel's deceased father, Josias Mace, in Dorchester County, Maryland.

"We believe John Dorris followed his nephew by marriage to Tennessee and settled

near him from 1795 to 1800"

"The State subdivided Sumner county in 1799, creating three large counties--Sumner to the west, Smith to the east and Wilson to the south."

"John Dorris must have moved to Smith County as early as 1803 when he registered nine acres on the west bank of the east fork of Goose Creek. The purchase was from state land warrant #480 first granted to William Martin. (See Smith County Deeds E/303. David Looney was listed as a neighbor."

John registered an additional 31 acres from a Jabez Gifford on Goose Creek in April 1805. This land was adjacent to the nine acre purchase. the deed described the land as situated "on the east fork of Goose Creek on the northwest side of the creek on a bluff" adjacent to Jeremiah Taylor and Jesse Lawrence's land. (See Smith County Deeds B/370-371 dated April 7,1805. John paid \$100 for 31 acres. Jonah Howell, John Jones witnessed the transaction)

These forty acres remained his homestead until 1817. He sold out his forty acre homestead and moved to Caney Fork in Sumner County. Smith County Court Minutes (See Volume 10/223-229) contain the tax rolls for that county from 1817-1822. No Dorrises appeared on these lists, providing additional evidence that John Dorris the Elder moved to Sumner County after 1817.

John Dorris left Smith County in 1817 and moved to the Caney Branch of Drake Creek on the Sumner County side of the line. According to Drury family tradition, John's wife, Angel Mace Dorris, died prior to his removal to Sumner County in 1817. Her death, Drury tradition claims was a contributing factor to his departure. Supporting this tradition is the fact that John Dorris appeared in the 1820 Sumner Co. Tenn. Census without a spouse.

The County tax rolls record that he was holding 96 acres on Caney Fork in 1820 which he sold to Samuel Alley in 1823. This land was on Drakes Creek on Big Barren River.

John left Tennessee in the late 1820s and arrived in Marion County, Illinois He appeared there in the 1830 census with his sons, Josiah, Elijah, William and James. The census records indicate that his daughter Mary was still living in his household and Thomas was living in his brother Josiah's household. John Dorris died shortly after moving to Marion County, perhaps as late as 1833 when his daughter Mary and son-in-law left the county. If John Dorris was 25 when his first child was born then John was probably born before 150 and lived a full life to over 80 years of age. "

Notes for NANCY:

From Dorris -Net March 31,1997 Volume 3 Issue 1

"John Dorris also appeared in the medical records of Dr. Benjamin VanKirk of Howell Township, Hunterdon County, New Jersey from January 1777 to April 1784. Van Kirk was a neighbor listed on the 1781 Hopewell Township tax rolls with John Dorris. His unique medical records mention a son and a daughter and a female in the household named Nancy, presumably John's first wife. Among the items for John Dorris in Van Kirk's Day Records, included a January 15, 1777, call on a "son"; April 21, 1777, visit for a "purge of son", a July 4, 1777, visit on a "daughter for vomit", a July 13, 1777, "visit in part;" a July 18, 1778, visit on a "daughter", a July 6, 1779, visit on a "son", and a September 17, 1781, visit for "two vomits". Other items included payment in October 1780, "by girl's work"; a December 13, 1781, "visit in part to spouse (sold two boxes of powder)" a March 13, 1782, "venesect (bleeding) for Nancy"; and an April 1784, "credit by daughter spinning flax of 5 shillings, leaving a balance 10 shillings." The last item indicates that John Dorris may have left New Jersey owning Van Kirk money. There is no record in Van Kirk's Day Books of a later payment. The Dorrises were from an area in northern Ireland which was

historically linked to the linen trade. It is not surprising that the Dorrises brought their skills of this industry with them to the American colonies and one of John's daughters could spin flax. "

John disappeared from New Jersey records in 1784., next appearing in North Carolina in 1787. We know from two powers of attorney recorded in Orange County North Carolina in 1794 that John Dorris married Angel Mace of Dorchester County Maryland. We believe that he traveled to the eastern shore of Maryland between 1784 and 1787 where he met and married Angel. John's brother ,the Reverend Joseph Dorris,was the matchmaker in this marriage. According to family tradition Joseph married a Mary Griffin from the eastern shore of Maryland circa 1773. The Griffins and Maces had close ties for almost a century.

Notes for ANGEL MACE:

From the book My Dorris Family Line by Burnice Dorris Waggoner come the following notes: Page 18

John Dorris was married to Angel Mace of Dorchester County, Maryland, probably in the 1760's. The Mace family was a well established , land-owning family in this county.

I do not know how or where John met and married his wife, but this is a strong indication that old William Dorris lived in Dorchester County before moving to New Jersey. The court records in Orange County, North Carolina for May 26,1794 show a power of attorney executed by Angel Mace Dorris and her brother , Ezechie Mace authorizing a man in Dorchester County, Maryland to sell the land of their deceased father Josies Mace.

On Page 21 is another note which reads:

John Dorris's wife, Angel Mace, lived in the same neighborhood as Mary Griffin. In fact, their parents ' farms seemed to join. The two families were involved in exchange of land in 1712 and in 1743. John Dorris probably married a few years before Josphe Doris. The Mace and Griffin families were Scotch or Scotch-Irish. There is some indication that these families may have been Catholic. Maryland suffered considerable religious turmoil at times. At one time people may have been induced to change religion because of particular tax. These families lived in Dorchester County. Joseph and Mary Dorris had their first child October 22,1773 while living on Maryland's Eastern Shore. This was my great great grandfather,John Irwin Dorris. His middle name may have been in honor of Joseph's mother. They also had a son William. They had two children who died during childhood and after this Mary Griffin Dorris died.

From the Dorris-Net March 31, 1997 Volume 3 issue 1

"The Griffins and Maces had close ties for almost a century. Both families belonged to a small, closely knit Catholic community which had settled in Dorchester County on Meekins Neck of Hoopers Island.

Angel's great, great grandfather was Nicholas Mace who settled in Dorchester Co. in 1664. According to local history, the Maces were originally Catholic but in the 18th Century converted to "Old School" Baptists. We assume the Maces became primitive Baptists and may have converted during the "Great Awakening" after the Revolution. Nicholas appears to have been a descendant of Rowland Mace, transported to Maryland in 1640.

We belive Angel was John's second wife . We know that John Dorris had a son and a daughter by 1777 and that the daughter was sufficiently mature by 1784 to have spun flax to satisfy a debt to Van Kirk. Angel Mace would have been a very young

bride to have been the mother of those children.

"The public records show that Angel Mace was the daughter of Josias and Anna Mace and the great great granddaughter of Nicholas Mace Sr. She is listed in the will of her father Josias Mace III in 1774 along with her sisters Amelia, Sarah and Elizabeth and brother Ezekiel. She next appeared in the public record twenty years later as the wife of John Dorris. At that time Angel, her brother Ezekiel Mace and John Dorris appeared in Orange County Court in May 1794 , giving a power of attorney to Edmund Brannock, probably a distant cousin, to sell her father's land as the only "surviving children" of Josias Mace III . A similar writ was issued in Dorchester County Court through Alexander Robb, described as an uncle.

Notes for NANCY DORRIS:

From Dorris Net Volume 3 Issue 1 , dated March 31, 1997
page 7.

"John Dorris witnessed the will of Abram Eckols in March 1823 , along with Isaac Walton. Eckols had been living in the Mansker area. According to Davidson County marriage records, a Nancy Dorris had married Eckols in 1815. Eckols' wife Nancy Dorris Eckols served as his executor. Nancy remarried joining in wedlock with Ashford Napier in July 1823. Currel Keen, John Dorris the Elder's neighbor on Caney Fork, served as bondsman.

We suspect that Nancy was the daughter of John Dorris the Elder and may have been the daughter mentioned in the Van Kirk medical records of Huntington County, New Jersey from his first wife. That this daughter was named Nancy would not be surprising since we believe John Dorris's first wife was named Nancy. For this Nancy Dorris to have been a daughter from John's first marriage she would have to have been in her late 30's, and that would have been a late first marriage for a woman in those days. We do not know what happened to Nancy and her second husband who may have moved west also.

For Johns other children the public record is richer with data. John Dorris the Elder's son William Dorris (1789-) appears to have been the oldest of John and Angel

Mace Dorris' children, being born around 1789 in North Carolina.

the few records we have on this William Dorris first show him in Smith County,

Tenn. in August 1817, where the Smith County court listed him as guarantor in a land case. (See Smith Countny Court Minutes VII 344.) In November 1819, the Smith County Court appointed him guardian for the children of Davis Foster. His father, John Dorris and George Denny served as securitors.(See Smith County Court Minutes VIII 62.)

William resided in the Caney Fork Creek area from 1823 to 1829 when he departed with his father for Marion County, Illinois. He appeared throughout this period on the Sumner County Tax rolls, holding 50 acres in 1823. His land holdings had inceased to 68 acres by 1829 when he left with his father for Marion Co., Illinois. William's stay

in Illinois was a short one, and he returned to Tennessee, appearing in the John Drury accounts in 1837. He appeared in neighboring Macon County, formerly part of Sumner and Smith counties, in the 1850 Census. That census identified his wife Millie an his sons, Eli, Wesley, Josiah and Mordica.

Several of his sons later moved to Sumner County. There both Wesley and Josiah were closely identified with Davis David Dorris (1820-1897) whom we blieve was also William and Millie Dorris's son. Davis married Belinda Hodges in 1843 in Sumner County and then was briefly in Fulton County, Illinois where he appeared on the 1850 Census listed as a carpenter with two children, William and John. He returned to Sumner County where he witnessed a land purchase in 1867 on Brushy Fork of Bledsoe Creek.

Wesley Dorris (1824-?) also settled in Sumner County, purchasing land on the

Dry Fork of Drakes Creek in 1850 from Fielding Alley. He married Octavia Morton, daughter of William Morton, sometime after 1850. His brother Josiah J. Dorris(1826-?) also moved with him to Sumner County purchasing 73 acres on the Caney Fork of Drakes Creek in 1856 and 1857. One the eve of the Civil War in 1860, he sold his land and moved to Missouri. There he enlisted and fought for the Union under Captain H. Murray's I Company of the Missouri 16th Infantry.

Notes for RACHEL DORRIS:

"Three of John Dorris the Elders daughters, Rachel, Rebecca and Nancy, stayed behind in Tennessee with their husbands and did not travel west with their father and

brothers to Illinois. According to Drury family historian, Steven Driver, Rachel Dorris Drury (1792-?) was born in North Carolina, She married John Drury circa 1810 in Smith County, Tennessee. John Drury was born in Maryland and was the third son of Joseph and Libby Wiggington Drury. Joseph Drury was born in 1751 in Maryland and died in Bedford Co., Virginia in 1806. He served as a private in the 2nd Regiment of the Charles County, Maryland Militia during the American Revolution from 1778 to 1779 and was reputedly an ordained Baptist Minister.

After Joseph Drury passed away John Drury, his brother George and his mother moved to Smith Co., Tenn, where they settled on land adjacent to John Dorris the Elder.

John Drury must have met, courted and married Rachel Dorris in a short time as their first child, Polly was born on July 4, 1811. John and Rachel had eight more children including, William (1813) Elizabeth (1817) Lucinda (1819) Delila (1821) Stephen (1823) George (1827-1885) Francis (1818) and Martha (1834)

John Drury served as a private in Captain Anthony Metcalf's Company under Colonel Thomas McCrory's West Tennessee Militia during the war of 1812 and later drew a pension. Drury belonged to a group of three month volunteers who enlisted to fight the Creeks but never reached their target as their service expired. He was marshalled into the army on October 4, 1813, marched south from Fayetteville, Tenn to Fort

Strother and then was mustered out on January 4, 1814. The dispersal of this force infuriated Andrew Jackson, who eventually went south and defeated the Creeks at the Battle of Horseshoe Bend in March 1814. Reverend Joseph Dorris was a Chaplain with Jackson's forces at that critical battle. "

"After John Drury returned from his three months in the army he apparently began to operate a store on Drury Ridge.

After 1820 there was marked improvement in the financial status of the John Drury family and by the 1840's they were doing quite well. The Civil War destroyed these families economically and these families never recovered."

TN, daughter of JAMES DRURY and SYBIL WIGGINGTON. She was born 08 Nov 1796 in Bedford Co., VA, and died 11 Jan 1889 in Modoc Co., CA.

From notes from Kenneth Dorris, he wrote the following and I quote:

"The Gold Rush was one of the attractions that caused them to go to California"

"Several of John Dorris the Elder's sons did not move to Sumner County in May 1817.

but stayed behind in Smith County where they developed close ties with the Drury and Davis families. John's son Josiah Dorris (1798-1871) married Lucy Drury in SmithCounty in May 1816. Drury family historian Steven Drier records that Lucy

had a brother, John Drury, who married Josiah's sister, Rachel Dorris. Lucy also had a sister named Patsy who married Wade Davis in Sumner County on May 23,1813. Wade Davis , so the Davis family researches claim, as a close friend of

Josiah Dorris, and the two of them migrated north briefly to Breckenridge County, Kentucky shortly after their marriage to the two Drury sister.

The excursion north to Kentucky was only a brief one: and Josiah returned to Smith County in the early 1820's where he was often linked with his brother James Dorris (1800-1858)

Josiah and James joined their father John Dorris in his migration to Marion County, Illinois in the late 1820's . Josiah and James Dorris appeared in the 1830 Marion County Illinois Census near their father. Josiah and another brother, Thomas Dorris (1808-1886) then moved to Fulton County, Illinois in 1831.

During their brief stay in Fulton County both Josiah and Thomas were active politically in the county , running for public office in 1831. Josiah won the position of Justice of the Peace but his brother Thomas lost his bid to be Otter Township Sheriff to Wade Davis.

"Both Josiah and Thomas enlisted to fight in the Black Hawk War in 1832 in Fulton County and both later drew pensions from their duties. Josiah and Thomas were still in Fulton Countyin 1835 when the State recorded Josiah Dorris on its census of that year. Josiah lost his bid in that year for reelection as Justice of the Peace and moved off to Missouri shortly thereafter.

Josiah moved off to Platte, County, Missouri shortly thereafter with Wade Davis and eventually migrated to the Far West, settling in Northern California and growing to be an old man and patriarch of a distinguished line of the clan. the town of Dorris, Calif received its name from this lineage of the clan.

on Page 1, 4th paragraph, she wrote the following:

In 1846 Presley A. Dorris, his brother Cyrus Grundy, and his father Josiah enlisted in the United States Army and came to California during the Mexican war. After the war they were mustered out and returned to their eastern home. Presley came to California three times, once by the Isthmus of Panama which he crossed on foot. After a time he returned to the east to bring the members of his family to California.

The party made the long trek across the plains. En'route two sisters, Amanda Melvina and Leathe Parlee, died of mountain fever and are buried at the sink of the Humboldt. A brother Hiram, and Hiram's wife, also died. A son, James Dorris, survived this couple. This son together with his uncles Presley A., Columbus, Carlos Jefferson and Cyrus Grundy, their parents and two sisters, Parthena and Catherine, continued the journey to California. They drove their stock with them across the plains, as they came to California to raise cattle.

Very important note:

A correction to the above statement is made by Floyd Dorris, Jr. only Hiram died, his wife and son lived and continued on, see note regarding this writing on page for Presley Alexander.

Presley passed on in 1901 and Carlos J., six years later in 1907. The brothers never married. They are buried in the Alturas Cemetery in the family plot with their mother, Lucy, Brother Columbus and his wife Rachel and other relatives. Their father, Josiah Dorris, is buried in Benicia, California.

Mrs. Lee also wrote of Presley that he was a kindly man with a great love for humanity -- color or creed made no difference to him. He allowed the Indians to build their wigwams or homes on his D ranch, and often gave them cattle from his herds to kill and eat. The Indians had great respect for him.

She continued to write: "after his disposal of the D. Ranch in Siskiyou County, Pres returned to the Dorris Ranch in Modoc County, where he spent the remaining days with his brother, Carlos, who was in poor health. Both were tenderly cared for in their last days by their sister-in-law Mrs. Columbus Dorris, and sons William J. and Presley S., who had charge of the Modoc County Ranch. The elder Dorrises were fond of the nephews, and as their occupations were the same, they were comrades as well. Presley and Carlos passed their last days in peace and quiet. They could be found sitting quietly on the front porch of their brother (Columbus's) old homestead. Two grey haired, grey bearded old southern gentlemen with their faces turned toward the East -- their thoughts, who knows, mayhap of their beloved Siskiyou. "

"James Dorris had moved to Wayne Co., Illinois by 1840 where he appeared in the Census of that year. James also appeared in the 1850 Wayne County Census but passed away 1858 and did not appear on the next census. According to the census record James was born in 1798 in Tennessee with a wife,Lul (1806-Tennessee) and a son Wilk (born 1825,Tenn.) and daughters S.A. (1826 Tenn.) Jane (1828 Illinois) S.T. (1832 Illinois)M.M. (1833 Illinois) H.M. (1835 Illinois) and F.(1837, Illinois)

We believe James had another son, John G. Dorris, who served in the 3rd Illinois in the Mexican War and was born in 1828. We do not know his place of birth. "John Dorris , Jr. appeared in the sumner County tax rolls for Caney Fork with his father from 1823 through 1829 and continued to hold land in Sumner County at least through 1836. John Dorris appeared in Shelby County, Illinois in the 1830 Census. We assume that John Dorris, Jr. moved north with his father in 1828 or 1829 as Shelby County is adjacent to Marion County, Illinois. According to later census data, John's sons , Simpson (1828) and Moses (1832) and daughter Ellender(1830) were born in Illinois.

While John Dorris, Jr. was in Illinois he continued to appear on the Sumner tax rolls indicating that he only had temporary residence in Illinois and never sold his property in Tennessee. John then moved back to Sumner County for several years as evidenced from census data that shows that John Jr.'s daughter Sarah (1834) and son William (1837) were born in Tennessee.

John Dorris , Jr. sold out a part of his estate on Caney Fork in Sumner County in September 1835 to Jacob Brown. This 80 acre tract combined both John Sr. and John Jr.'s land. The deed described the land as being adjacent to that of Isham and Holly Hodges and on the west boundary of John Dorris, Sr's 100 acre survey. John Sr. apparently never sold out his Sumner lands, passing them instead to his son.
(See Sumner County Deeds 21/93)

John Dorris , Jr. wife Elizabeth Henson, was a member of a large family living on the Caney Fork near the Dorrises in Sumner County. According to tax rolls there were at least three Henson households in the Caney Fork community in 1825, John Henson with 215 acres on Caney Fork and single heads of household Eli and Solomon Henson.

Sometime after 1837 John and Elizabeth Henson Dorris moved to Walker County Alabama where John appeared in both the 1840 and 1850 Censuses. The Dorrises migrated southward with a part of the Henson clan. Eighty three year old John Henson appeared as a Dorris neighbor in 1850 with his wife Elizabeth. John's eldest daughter , Mary (1824-?0) was then living with the Hensons. The Eli and William Henson families were also neighbors. We assume that John Henson was Elizabeth's father and that Eli and William were her brothers.

John Dorris, Jr. died prior to 1860 and his sons, Simpson, Moses and William (with his sisters Mary and Ellender) appeared as heads of households in the 1860 Census. John's daughter Nina had married Jesse Robins Jr. circa 1843 and they were living in a separate household near the Dorris clan. Both Simpson and Moses married prior to the Civil War, Simpson to a Mary Sullivan in 1854 and Moses to another woman named Mary. They and their brother William all joined F Company of the 28th Alabama Infantry as privates in 1861. Moses died of war wounds in 1862. Simpson contracted a severe intestinal problem during the war and died in the spring of 1866 from eating too many plums!

"Daughter May Dorris Yokum (1809-1879) first appeared in public records in 1830 in Marion Co. Illinois when she married Stephen Yokum. The marriage license is dated September 14, 1830. On the back of the bond is a statement by Henry W. Wiggins that he joined the couple in wedlock on that day.

According to a published history of McDonough County, Illinois Mary married Stephen Yokum in Marion Co. on Sept. 29, 1829, and moved four years later to McDonough County. Memories of wedding anniversaries are hazy at best but to have missed this one by one year may have been the cause of more than one battle in the Yokum household.

Yokum was born in Montgomery Co. Kentucky where his father ran a sawmill. He had been married and divorced and had custody of his children, see info on this, too much to type here.

Yokum served in the Black Hawk War in 1832 as First Lieutenant in the Illinois 8th Regiment from Marion County. He reputedly rose to the rank of Major, traveling North through McDonough Co. Impressed with the richness of the land further north, Stephen and Mary moved to that County should thereafter, where Mary's brother Thomas Dorris, eventually joined them.

According to one Yokum family legend Abraham Lincoln was "Colonel" in the same division as Yokum during the Black Hawk War. After Lincoln was elected President Yokum went to Springfield to visit him. Yokum's tombstone had "First Lieutenant" carved into it.

Yokum arrived in McDonough County around 1833 where he settled in what later was to become New Salem Township in Section 19. His biographer claimed that he was the first settler on the north bank of Camp Creek. Stephen and Mary Yokum raised a large family of nine daughters and two sons. Their children included Jane, Amanda, Talitha, Mary Jane, Catherine, William, George, Eliza, Clarissa, Susan and Elisa Ann. The tragedy of their life was the death of their son, George, during the Civil War. He died at the Battle of Stone River while fighting for the 84th Illinois. Yokum died in 1874 and was buried at the Presbyterian Cemetery at Pennington Point where a monument to his son, an MIA whose body was never returned was also erected. Mary Dorris Yokum passed away in 1879 at the age of 70.

One of the Drury sisters from Smith County was also living in McDonough County in 1840. This was Fanny Drury Hankins, wife of Fielding Hankins, whose sister Lucy Drury had married Josiah Dorris. We assume that the Hankins accompanied Josiah and Thomas Dorris and Wade Davis in travelling from Tennessee to Illinois by opted out of traveling further to California and stayed with Thomas and the Yokums."

From the writings of Mrs Lee A. James, I have copied what she has to say regarding the above:

"This data on Hiram Casey Dorris was given by Floyd Dorris Jr. of Portland, Oregon"

Hiram Casey Dorris is traced from South Carolina to North Carolina to West Virginia. He was crossing the plains with his brothers and family when he became ill and died on the Barlow Trail to Oregon in 1847, and is buried on Laurel Hill near Government Camp --Grave marked. Hiram's wife Elizabeth Miller or (Fulherson) and son James Josiah Dorris continued the journey with the Dorris Family. Elizabeth and son James settled in SCIO, Oregon. Where she sent her son to school. He later attended McMinnville College. At a young age he married Mary Ellen Shields, daughter of Captain James Shields, on April 1st, 1859. He taught school, belonged to Joab Powell's famous Providence Church(Baptist)

James Dorris and family moved to Modoc county to join uncles in founding town of Dorris Bridge. He opened first inn for travelers in a tent until lumber could be brought from Susanville. Helped his uncles in raising cattle. He then moved back to Oregon studied law, was appointed Justice of the peace, wrote political and religious papers, taught in Sunday school, maintained abstract office in Albany, Oregon court house. Died about 1890 of a heart attack on the street on way home from work one evening. James and wife Mary Ellen had 13 children. Matilda, Bertha, Hiram, Edward, Robert, Lake, Lucy, Albert, Frank, Floyd, Elizabeth, Willis, James.

+++++August 2005 I received some papers from the Dallas County Genealogical Society and among those papers was the obituary for P.J. Scarborough, it has given some definite answers to some questions, yes he was married to Mary Thompson it showed they had 3 daughters, his name was P.J. or Pompey, never Pete as shown in the 1910 Census, that was an error done by the person taking the census, and it has thrown me off on for many years, now realize without question that was an error by the census person and he never used that name. I will now print out the entire obituary .

Obituary

P.J. Scarborough was born July 19, 1829 at Union Cross Roads, Roan county, Tennessee. He grew up to manhood there and was married to Mary Thompson in 1847. To this union were born three daughters. In 1849 they moved to McComb, Illinois, and in 1852 sorrow darkened the home, the wife and mother laid down life's burden. On December 4, 1857, he married Martha M. Dorris in McComb, Illinois. In 1859 he came west and located at Jessup, Iowa and lived there five years. Then in 1869 moved to a farm near Earlham, Iowa. In 1877 he moved to a farm two miles south of De Soto. After years of arduous toil and feeling the weight of years, this good man moved his family to De Soto, and here resided to the day of his death. To this last marriage six sons and five daughters were born. In 1904 , on December 2, the death angel again came to this home and bore away the beloved wife.

The following children survive the father and will ever cherish his memory. Mrs.Jennie Wilson Hobbs, Mrs.Maggie Redfield and Mrs. Cora Simpson, all of Denver , Color., Mrs. Ida Krohn of Barker, Montana. Mrs. Nellie Payton of Oakes, N.D., Albert Scarborough of Des Moines. W.T. Scarborough of De Soto, Iowa , J.A. Scarborough of Valley Junction, Iowa Chas.Scarbrough of Peru,Iowa and Blanche Scarborough of De Soto, Iowa. All were present at the funeral service. On February 22, 1908 , he confessed Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized and united with the Christian Church and to the last hour of life was loyal to Him whom he then confessed and died after a few weeks illness in the triumph of a living faith, on May 13 , 1910 at 4:30 a.m. at the ripe age of 80 years, 9 months and 24 days.

He was a good citizen and an honest man, a loving husband and father, a faithful friend and a Christian man. The funeral services were held in the Christian Church on Lord's day , May 15, at 2:00 o'clock p.m. conducted by the pastor J.C. Hanna, assisted by Rev. Foutch of the M.E. Church . The singing was by a double quartette from both churches. The floral offerings were beautiful and in profusion. The church was crowded with friends and neighbors, thus attesting the love in which he was held. After the service the body was laid to rest in the Oakland cemetery beside the body of his wife to await the resurrection morn.
